The Institution of Nuclear Engineers and the British Nuclear Energy Society are pleased to announce the launch of the Joint Company Membership Scheme. The scheme replaces the existing INuE national and the BNES regional schemes with one Company Membership scheme offering benefits to Companies and their employees by encouraging the aims of the Societies in developing the learning and appreciation of nuclear energy and supporting educational initiatives.

The new scheme takes effect from 1st January 2007.

Foreword by the Presidents

The Institution of Nuclear Engineers and the British Nuclear Energy Society are moving to work closer together, which includes most regional branches now operating jointly and both organisations sharing one Executive Secretary and Secretariat. Both organisations are committed to promoting the benefits of nuclear power, informing the public and to the education and development of their members. As part of this we seek to work closely with the employing organisations to promote the interests of the individuals.

Against the background of both a focus on Decommissioning with the formation of the NDA and the prospect of nuclear new build the need for a well informed and educated workforce and the wider promulgation of the benefits of nuclear energy has hardly been greater. This new Company Membership Scheme is aimed at bringing benefits both to Companies and their employees and at the same time encouraging increased individual membership and promotion of the activities of the two Societies. It replaces the existing INuCE national and BNES regional schemes.

The income generated for the societies will typically, but not exclusively be utilised to support and expand the educational objectives and allow the expansion of the current schools projects and bursarship schemes operated locally.

The revised scheme embraces some of the changes that have been suggested and provides two levels of membership offering a choice of contribution and benefit. (Details are given in the attachment) For those of you that are already members of one of the current schemes we look forward to welcoming you to the new scheme and for those that are not currently members we hope that you will join.
